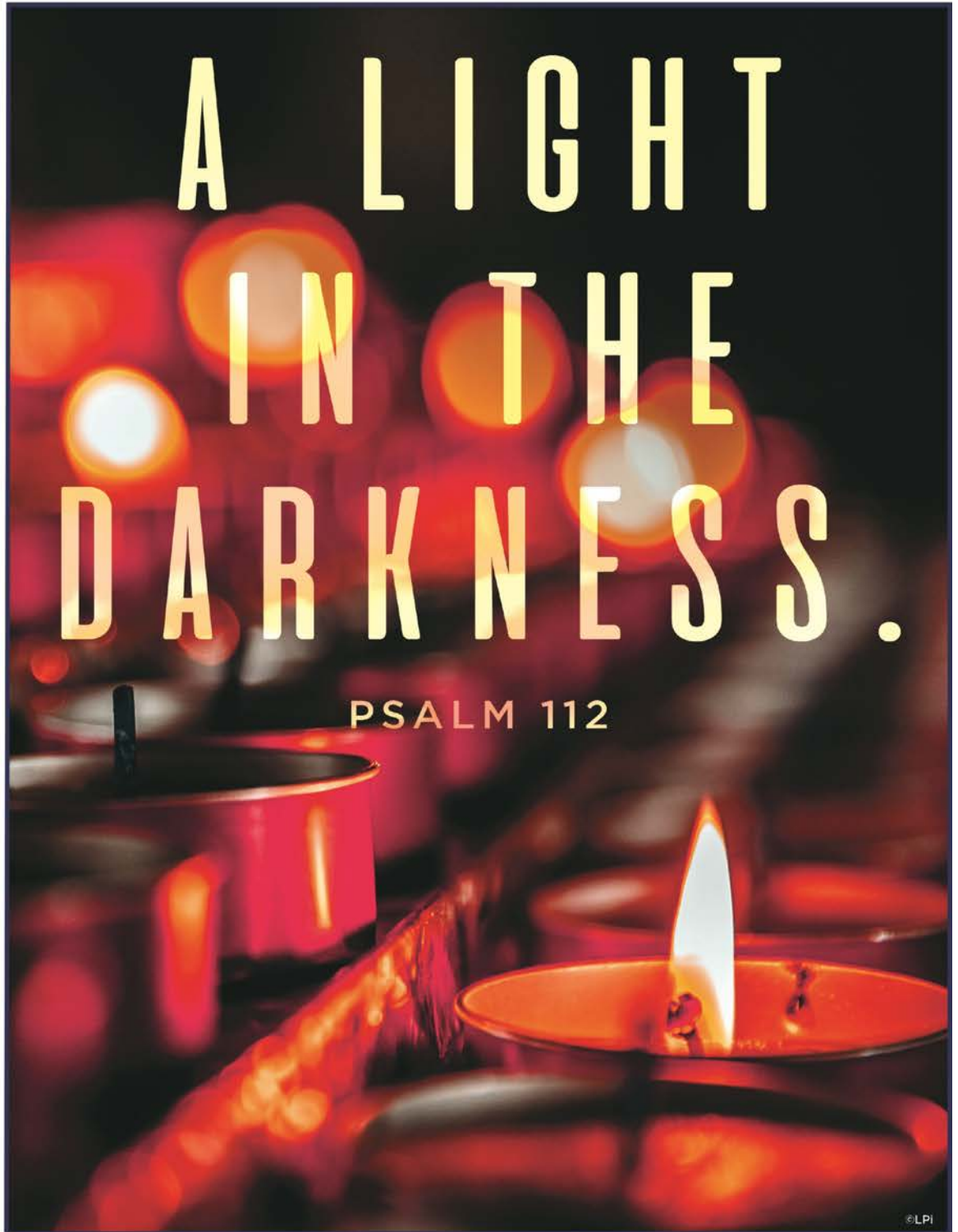

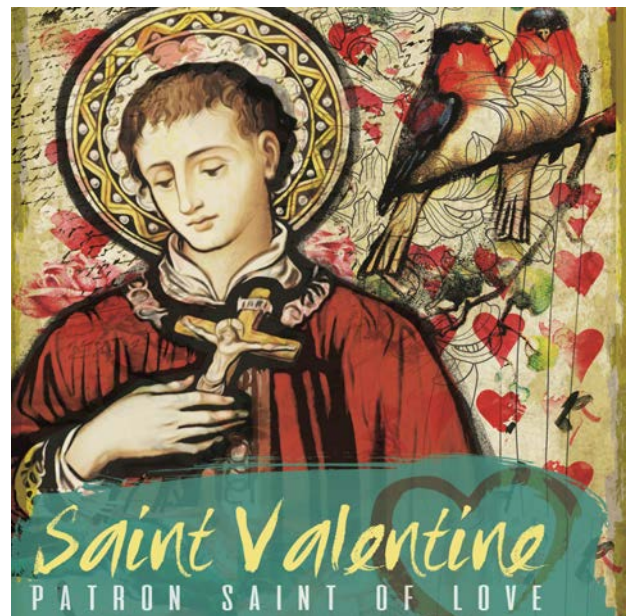

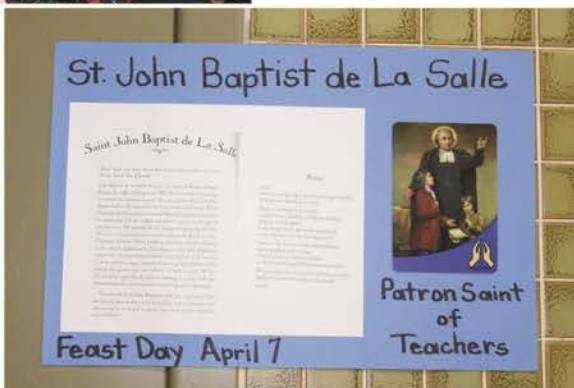

High School: June 22-28 • Knoxville, TN

Cost: \$99, with fundraising.

Middle School: June 28-July 1 • Waterford, WI

Love Begins Here provides middle school youth with an opportunity to encounter Jesus Christ in a life changing way through a 4-day, local mission trip where they live in Catholic community and continue His work on Earth!

What we'll do: We'll spend our days serving the community. Work varies but typically includes: yardwork, painting, and cleaning. This work may be done for elderly people in the community, homeless shelters, nursing homes, or other community organizations.

Where we'll stay: St. Thomas Aquinas Parish & School, Waterford.
