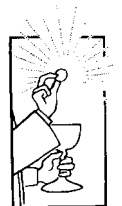

“What gifts did she leave you?”

Beverly and I were married in July of 1993. She died in April of 2009. I was accepted and entered the seminary in August 2010. Now I am a priest.

About one year after my wife died, as the people were leaving Mass, I was in the narthex of my home parish explaining to a parishioner my “story”. A woman I did not know, having overheard our conversation about my wife said as she passed by, “Oh, what gifts did she leave you?” Then, the lady disappeared. That question haunted me for the next six months. First, I was angry, “What gifts did she leave me? An empty house, no one to talk to, a hole in my heart the size of the Grand Canyon that will never heal, those are the gifts I got!” Despite my self-satisfying answer, the question still troubled me. I prayed on it.

Then, I started to see the gifts I had received: a new relationship with my daughters who had shared my sorrow, a new love for people, and an opportunity to serve them through God. Then, I thought of Jesus, the Gift of Gifts. What gifts did Jesus leave us by dying on the Cross? Did he leave us only with pain and sorrow? Did he leave us with despair and desolation? Did Jesus' dying leave us alone? For a while, after my wife died, I felt that way. Then the angel came and asked me that little question, but didn't even wait for an answer. I could not see the gifts of Jesus until I came to a balance of the gifts given me with my wife's death.

Jesus was walking with me the whole time. Saints and angels were in the room as my daughters and I experienced that terribly sacred event. I realized that Jesus' death is only a part of the story, the night before the morn. The gift of gifts was the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord. We have been saved. No, better than that, we have been adopted! We are children of God- the gift of gifts. Lent is coming soon, time to appreciate your gifts.

If you carry a hole in your heart, as I do, meditate on the gifts that loss has brought you. It may seem cruel at first, but on contemplation you will come to find the pattern of life. You will be led to the Cross, then to the Resurrection... and then to the arms of God, your Father. Where you will find peace.

Organ Report - Update

The Christ King Organ Committee met on Sunday, January 22, 2017. The task of acquiring scope pricing from four organ companies is now complete and we have begun the difficult process of narrowing our choices to two organ companies. All the proposals submitted to the group were very exciting and would enhance our prayer and worship life for generations. Two of the companies sent a representative (the company owner) to worship with us for a weekend to see and hear our church space before making formal proposals. Many of the companies submitted more than one proposal and all were enthusiastic about building an organ for our beautiful church. The organ committee proposed the following action steps:

1. Scott Riedel (our consultant), Bill Lieven and a number of committee members will do further research by playing and listening to two more examples of finalists work located in St. Louis and Chicago.
2. Generate a report which includes the two companies being considered, projected costs of project, rational for the project etc.
3. Communicate with all companies that submitted proposals to thank them for their proposals and let them know if they are still in consideration for the work.

Thanks to all who have shared their time and expertise to bring us to this stage of the project.
