



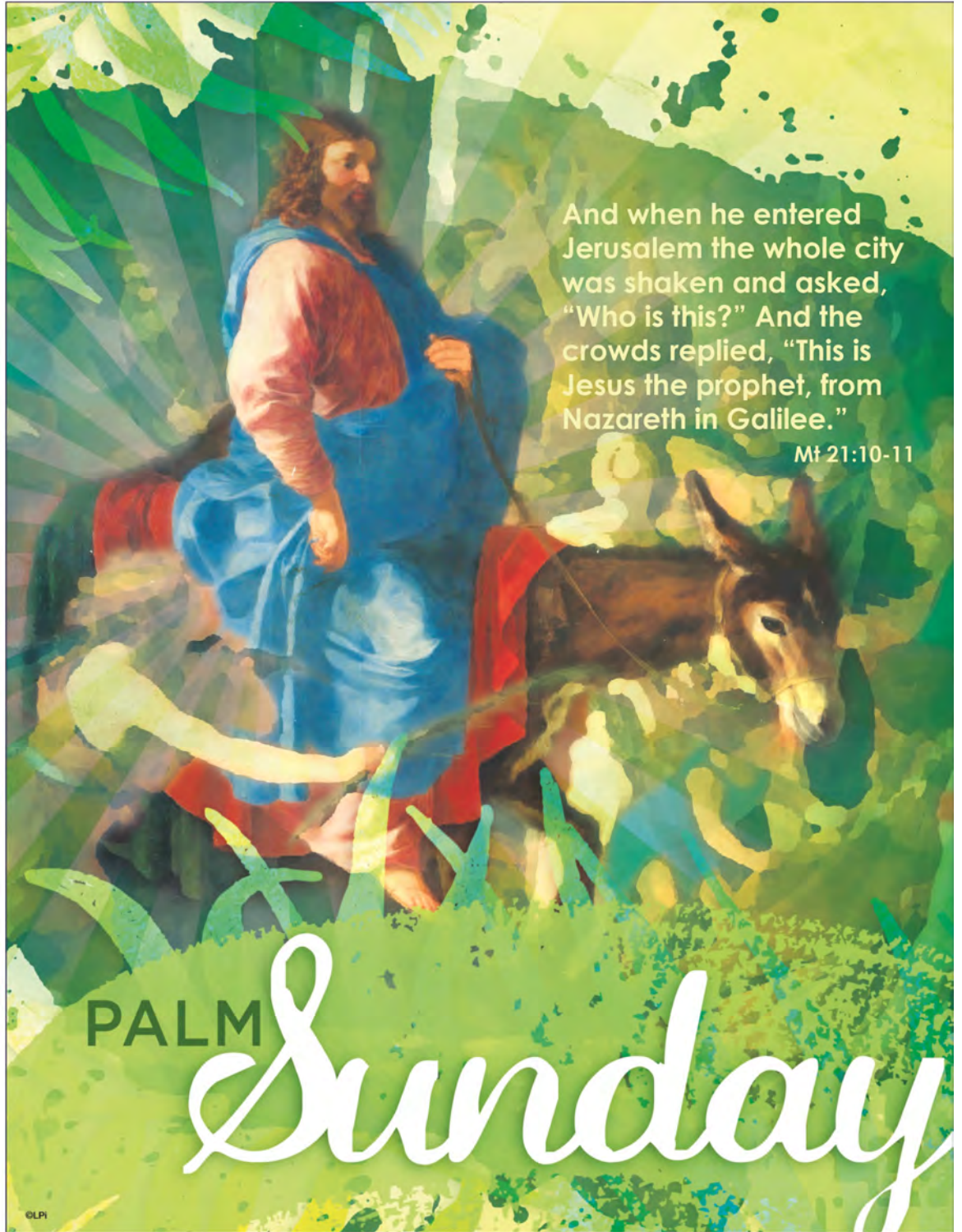

Lenten Disciplines of Fasting & Abstinence

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

Blessing of Food

The Polish custom of Swieconka, the blessing of food and wine, has become a tradition at Christ King. Easter foods are symbolic of our liberation from the dietary laws of the Old Testament as well as from the Church's Lenten fasting laws. Food and Easter baskets will be blessed at Christ King on Holy Saturday at 11:00AM.

Holy Thursday Food Donation

As in previous years, all parishioners attending the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday are encouraged to bring with them a non-perishable food item that will be collected and will be presented with the rest of the gifts in the offertory procession. This food will be donated to the local food pantry. Thank you!

- Join a Bible study. Christ King's Simply the Word Catholic Scripture Study offers welcome companionship for your journey with God's sacred Word.

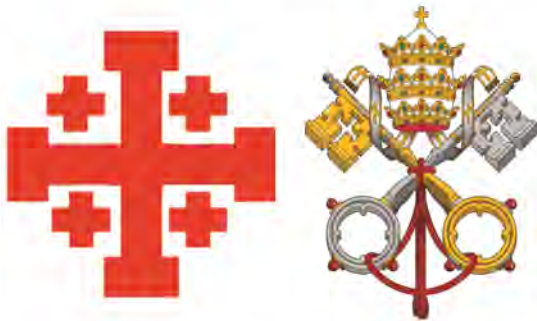
