EASTER SACRAMENTS

During the Easter season, we are all drawn more deeply into the sacramental mystery. Beginning at the Easter Vigil, when the elect—embraced by the assembly—are lead to the waters of the font, and immersed into the death and Resurrection of Christ Jesus, sealed with the sacred chrism of Confirmation, finally to approach the table of the Eucharist, the whole community is renewed and invited to an even more intimate encounter with the Risen Christ. We are reminded that each of us was baptized for the Bread of Life and the cup of salvation—and that every time we receive the body and blood of Christ, we also encounter the new life in the Risen Lord, first received at our baptism.

For reflection: How does the celebration of the Easter sacraments invite me to a more intimate union with the Risen Christ?

St. Vincent de Paul Special Collection April 16th / 17th

All Catholics, as followers of Jesus, are called to respond in love to people in need. Pope Francis has emphasized this calling in a special way, declaring 2016 an Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy, reminding us that Mercy is the very foundation of the Church's life. Vincentians respond to this call as part of an organized effort to grow in their faith while giving witness to God's love for the most distressed.

The Christ King St. Vincent de Paul Conference assists area families in need, making face-to-face visits to provide spiritual and material assistance—typically food, clothing or furniture. Over the last 3 years we've grown from 7 to 14 members. Our goals are simple: share God's love and guide people to self-sufficiency. We are blessed to live in an affluent community where relatively few live in or on the edge of poverty, and so for the last two years we've partnered with St. Michael's Parish on 24th Street near Vliet Street, taking referrals for their neighborhood. In 2015 we served 151 clients via 67 home visits, disbursing \$17,620.

The majority of our funds come from directly Christ King parishioners via special Mass collections. (Note that the Share Sunday boxes are for the St. Vincent de Paul meal program and do NOT fund our home visits.) It's been six months since our last special request for assistance at Mass, and we expect to exhaust our funds later this quarter. We therefore ask you to prayerfully consider making a donation. We will be conducting a special collection at the April 16th and 17th Masses, or you can mail / drop off a donation at the parish office, or in the collection boxes at the church entrances. Saint Anne Medal for Girl Scouts

The St. Anne Medal is the highest national recognition made available by the Catholic Committee on Girl Scouts. It has been approved for use in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee for adults who have served youth for a minimum of seven years in Girl Scout program areas. The purpose of the recognition is to honor the outstanding volunteer services of adults who have contributed to the spiritual development of Catholic youth through the Girl Scout programs and to encourage continuing involvement by faith filled adults in the Catholic formation of youth. I am proud that our parishioner Patti Hughes received this award in 2015. And this year, Susan Morris will be receiving the award. The requirements for this award are very extensive and both Patti and Sue were very strongly affirmed in this recognition. What I appreciate in particular about these two individuals is that they have assisted in many areas of the parish and in Girl Scouts at Christ King even when their own children were not necessarily involved. Many times we attach our volunteer work to a particular interest, such as serving as a catechist when our own child is enrolled in a particular religious education grade, for instance. Dennis or Deacon John may do the same. It is hard to know these scenarios unless you let us know or someone else does. And if you find yourself in the hospital, even if it seems minor, let us know and let us know if you would like a visit. Remember, because of privacy laws surrounding health care institutions, we have no idea you are somewhere unless you let us know or tell them specifically to call Christ King. Please do not be afraid to ask for a visit. I enjoy those visits far more than dealing with budgets and boiler repairs.

Tri Parish Director of Formation for Children

It is with great excitement that we are moving forward to hire a new Tri Parish Director of Formation for Children (a.k.a. Child Minister). This is an idea that the pastoral councils of the three parishes (Christ King, Saint Bernard, Saint Pius X) have supported over the course of 2014-2016. We now see such a great program in Youth Ministry under the leadership of Barb Abler. Because of that, we have seen broad support for this model in ministry to children in our area. We must always remember that parents are the primary formators of children in the faith, and this role will further help provide tools to assist parents in that role. It is the hope of the Committee that the Pastor, Principal and 8th grade homeroom and religious education teachers will again assist the committee in an advisory capacity.

Wellness Nurse

Our Wellness Nurse offers a wellness clinic twice monthly for parishioners of St. Bernard and Christ King. She is sponsored by St. Camillus Home Health Services and her services are complimentary to parishioners on the first and third Monday of the month from 8:30 to 9:30 AM in the hospitality room in the back of STB church. Through education, counseling, visits, health screenings, referrals and advocacy, the Wellness Nurse will assist parishioners in leading a healthier lifestyle. Some of the services provided include: health screenings (i.e. blood pressure checks), health education, medication management, community resource coordinator and health related presentations.

Marriage: Please make arrangements with a parish priest at least one year in advance because of preparation requirements.
