Basic Needs — Compassionate Care*

Our Christ King Conference of Saint Vincent de Paul helps needy people in several different ways. One of our primary works is to visit people in their homes in order to get to know them and, together, figure out how we can best help. Our visits are made in the parish boundaries of Christ King, St. Bernard, St. Pius and St. Michael at 24th and Vliet.

Every family is different and has their own story, but a typical theme is a family in a new home with little to no furniture. Here's one story. The name has been changed to ensure confidentiality.

"Sharon" is a thirty something year old woman with two high school aged boys. She just moved into the home across the street from her aging parents so the three generations can help each other out. A sofa was the only piece of furniture in her home. She was using the refrigerator in her parents' home to store her groceries and cooking with a hot pot and toaster oven. She lives in Milwaukee and works for an agency which transports her to a factory job near Oconomowoc. Her paycheck covers rent, utilities, and with the assistance of local food banks, enough groceries to feed herself and the growing boys.

We helped her with two beds from the SVdP store and a refrigerator from a used appliance store we partner with. She's trying to save to purchase a stove from the same store. Before we left, we prayed together and promised future prayers for each other.

We try to spend less than \$400 per family and can help as many families as we have funds. So far in 2017, we've helped 39 families, collected \$9,672 and spent \$9,402. All of our funds come from parishioner's generous donations.

We will be conducting a special collection at the June 3rd and 4th Masses, or you can mail/drop off a donation at the parish office or in the collection boxes at the church entrances. Thank you in advance for your support.

Financial Stewardship

June 30, 2017 is the end of our fiscal year. As I have often said, I am proud of our Finance Council and staff who have been so good at planning. Even with major unexpected events (e.g. the lateral line in front of church) we have adequate rainy day funds to avoid special collections. Thanks for your support.

However, we do need to dig a little deeper to ensure we end the year without a deficit. Due to some active parishioners who have died or moved away, we all need to step forward a little more generously. Let's ensure we hit June 30 with strong financial stewardship.

By the way, the hole out front of church is an eyesore, I know. Concrete work will start soon. Temperatures and precipitation has delayed their starting this work over the last few weeks. Waiting a little bit until late spring has also allowed us to properly bid the project and get it at a lower cost than a special project in the cold of winter.

It's been a while since I've provided a full financial update on the parish. We plan to do that over the summer. I want to ensure we have complete and accurate information to communicate whenever I convey this information. Stay tuned.

I remember watching part of a college graduation address where the speaker said, "With this degree you are commissioned to go into the world and make a difference." The imagery conjured up in my mind by the use of the

word "commissioned" was pretty powerful. I thought about the commissioning of military officers and the responsibility they took on for the lives of their subordinates but also the lives of those they protected. To me the word meant something very serious and solemn. It meant huge responsibility and expectation.

In the Bible, Jesus gives what we call the Great Commission:

"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Mt 28:19-20a).

The word commission makes this more than a suggestion or a hope. There is an expectation, a responsibility, and a mandate. Of course, did you wake up this morning thinking about how you would fulfill the Great Commission today?

Sharing the faith is not just something we should do; it is something we must do. The key is that you don't need to speak all the time to share. It will be through your life of stewardship that others will be able to see Jesus. By giving of yourself, by always responding to the call, and by surrendering all to God, you will lead others to become disciples, to seek out the sacraments, and to observe his teachings. Yes, responding in full to the Great Commission, great things can happen.
