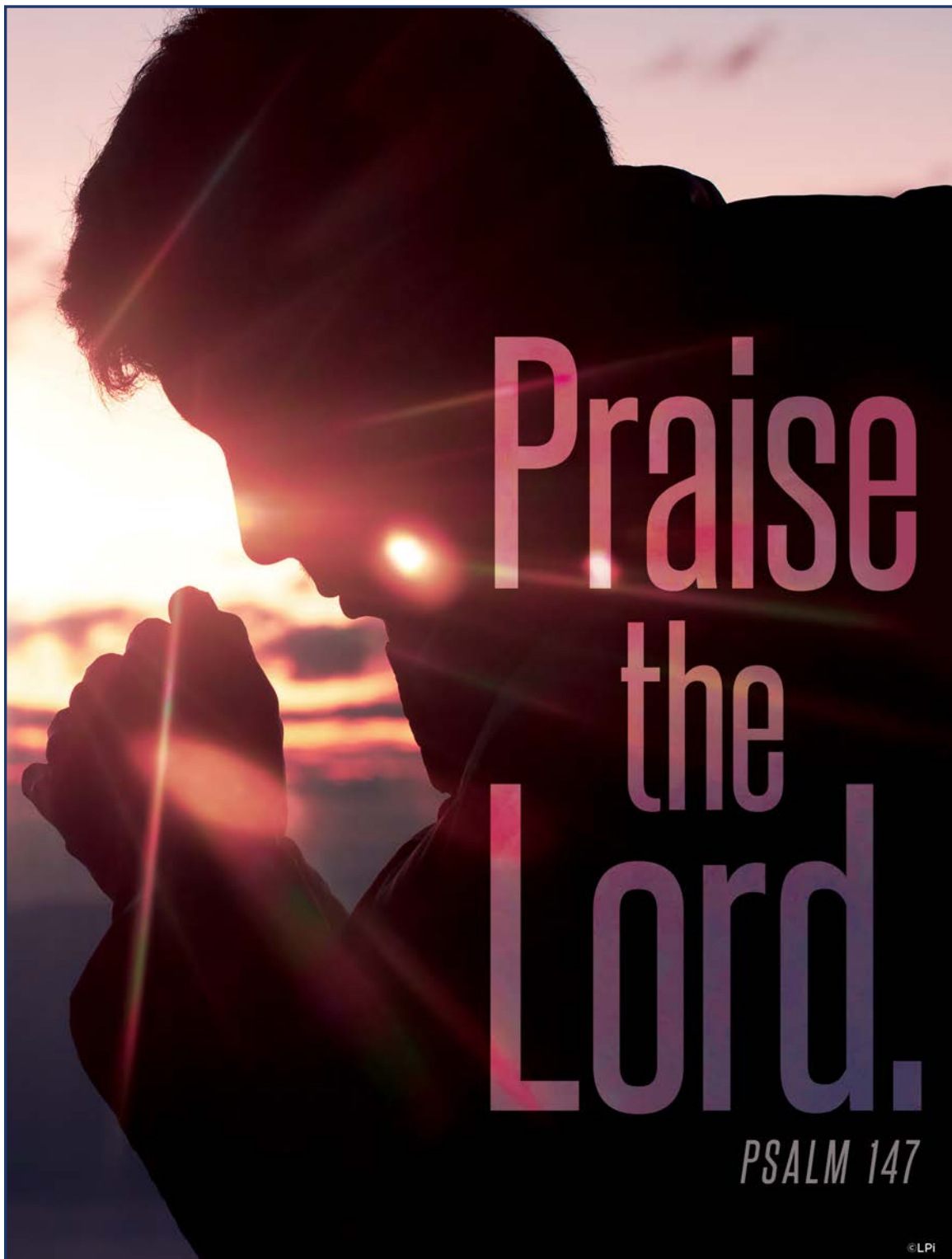

## LOOK AHEAD

Fr. Phillip has been developing a significant partnership between Saint Bernard and Christ King, and All Saints and Saint Martin de Porres Parishes in the City of Milwaukee. We ask for your help in following your Son, so that prejudice and animosity will no longer infect our minds or hearts but will be replaced with a love that respects the dignity of each person.

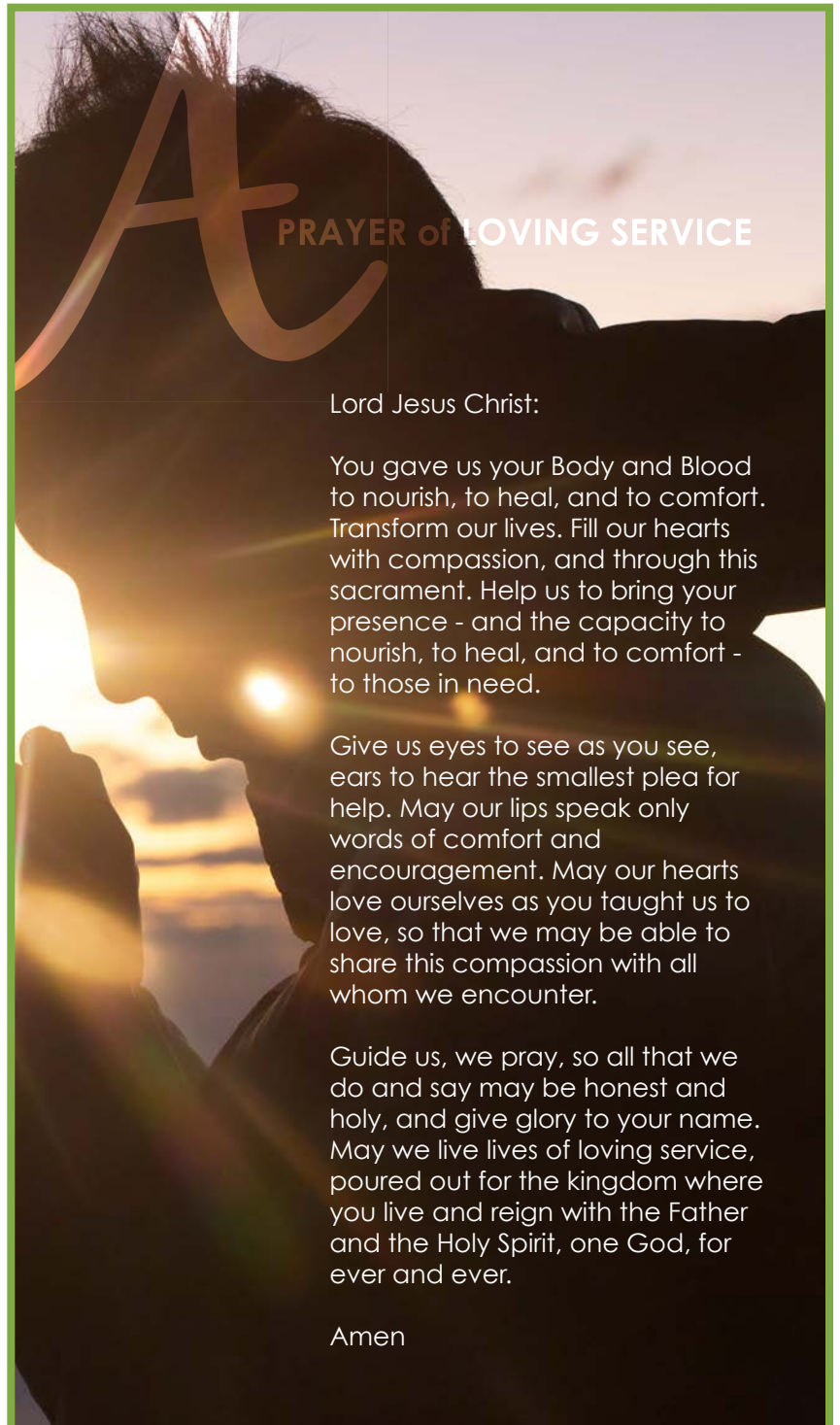
## ANOTHER SPECIAL FEAST?

This weekend, the priest gets to forestall wearing Ordinary Time green for one more week as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. For most of us, the name of this feast brings to mind the consecrated bread and wine. On one level, this thinking is correct! As Catholics, we recognize and adore the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, the bread and wine; but to restrict our thinking to this one aspect is to ignore a significant facet of this celebration.

St. Paul reminds us in his First Letter to the Corinthians that we, too, are members of the Body of Christ. Of the Eucharist, Pope Benedict XVI stated that it is "a call to holiness and a gift of oneself to one's brothers and sisters because each of us is truly called, together with Jesus, to be bread broken for the life of the world."

The Eucharist is the source and summit of our lives as Catholic Christians. We receive the Eucharist, and we become what we receive. We receive the strength and the inspiration; we are spurred into action - to go out to share with others, to serve others, to be Christ to the world.

To show our love for the Eucharist on the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, it is traditional for the faithful to form a procession, and carry the Blessed Sacrament through the streets, out into the world. We will not have this traditional procession this weekend. But we WILL have a procession of another form. As Mass ends today, and we walk out the doors of the church - we who have been united with Jesus Christ in Holy Communion - will put faith into action. As members of the Body of Christ, we will carry Christ into the world, to those who need aid, comfort, encouragement, and love.



Lord Jesus Christ:

You gave us your Body and Blood to nourish, to heal, and to comfort. Transform our lives. Fill our hearts with compassion, and through this sacrament. Help us to bring your presence - and the capacity to nourish, to heal, and to comfort - to those in need.

Give us eyes to see as you see, ears to hear the smallest plea for help. May our lips speak only words of comfort and encouragement. May our hearts love ourselves as you taught us to love, so that we may be able to share this compassion with all whom we encounter.

Guide us, we pray, so all that we do and say may be honest and holy, and give glory to your name. May we live lives of loving service, poured out for the kingdom where you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

## SACRED VESSELS



There's a stunning line from the movie *Witness*: "What you put in your hands, you put in your heart."

Chalices, cups, and patens are fashioned for a holy purpose. Great care has been taken in the crafting of these vessels. They must be worthy: capable of bearing the full weight of the mystery, awe, and wonder that liturgical action expresses. Liturgical vessels are sacred not because of the beauty of their design or the preciousness of the metal. They are sacred because they mediate divine presence to the assembly. We handle them with special reverence because these vessels "touch the Lord," and these vessels are, in turn, placed into the hands of the Christian community, which is itself the true vessel of the presence of Christ.
