

WHAT: Bring all your kids and hang out with other CK moms and kids Add it to your summer calendar! Please invite others that might be interested!



**Everyday Stewardship**

What power lies in a name? Have you ever met a "David," "Holly," or "Jack" and said, "They don't look like a David, Holly, or Jack"? Sometimes our name actually adds something to our person. Peculiar people sometimes have peculiar names. Some people of tremendous strength have names that we deem strong as well. Sometimes we give nicknames to people because of some attributes they exhibit. In the Bible, names mean a lot. Saul changes his name to Paul when he converts. Adam means "man," as in the first man. Eve means "to live" or "to breathe." Elizabeth took great care to name her son John as God commanded, even if other family members did not understand why such a unique name not found in their lineage. It was a unique name for a child who had a unique future of preparing the way for the Messiah.

We have our baptismal names, our surnames, our Confirmation names, and our maiden names. But all disciples of Jesus also bear the same name: Christian. People may wonder what does a David, Holly, or Jack really look like, but they should never wonder what a Christian looks like. Unfortunately, too often those who bear this name don't resemble the characteristics embodied in the name. Simply, a Christian looks like Christ. A Christian acts like Christ. A Christian truly is Christ to a world that seeks to uncover the true meaning of his name.

As Christians we are all called primarily to be in relationship with the Lord and to do this we must pray.

As summer  moves full speed ahead, don't allow yourself to slip into a new schedule that lacks prayer. If you plan to travel, do some research to check Sunday Mass times at a nearby Catholic Church. Try to take a few quiet moments in the morning to talk to God and do some spiritual reading before the day shifts into high gear with another adventure. Maybe even take in daily Mass once in a while. Who knows? Maybe these habits will stick and keep you refreshed when things pick up again in the fall.

And as you do head out to travel, whether it be for a day at the beach or a week up north, don't forget to ask for safety and guidance from your Guardian Angel!

Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here; ever this day, be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen.


