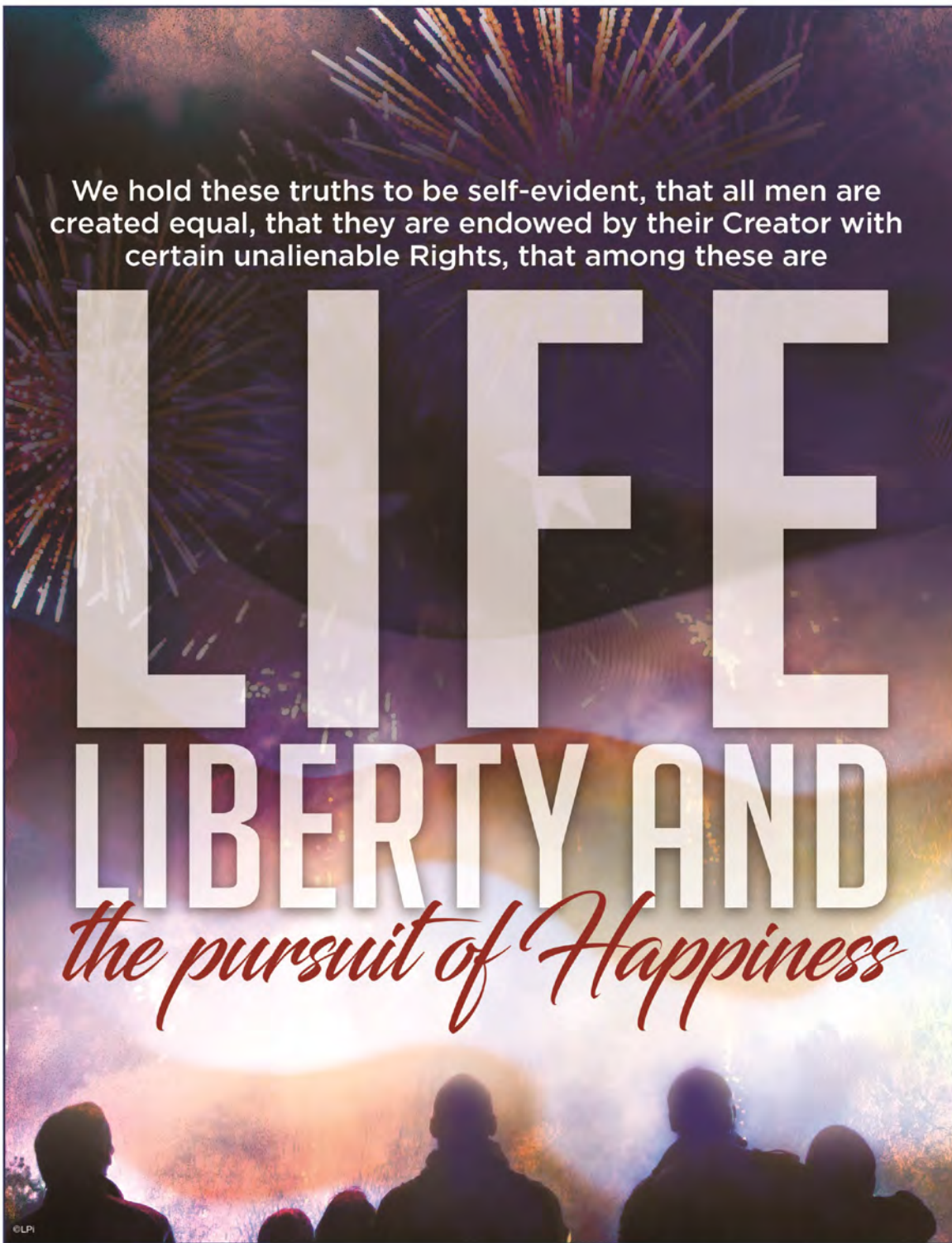

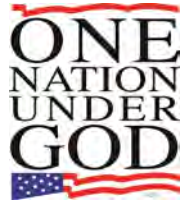

Children's Faith Formation

“Trust the Process”

Recently, these words became strikingly applicable!

Out of curiosity, I decided to take part in the Level 1/ Part 1 training for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, held here at Christ King a few weeks ago. I knew almost nothing about this method, only that:

- 1.) One of the two pillars of CGS is “Liturgy” (and “liturgy” is what I do!) and 2.) Everyone I have ever met who knows anything about this program is wildly enthusiastic about it!

At first, I was a bit confused. This is nothing like any religious education programs I'd experienced! Lessons were presented one-on-one—calmly, quietly—to the adult trainees who, for the week of training, were asked to become “like the children” they would eventually lead. The catechist sits on the floor with the child and together they talk and wonder about some of the most basic, and deepest, tenets of our faith. Only after a child receives a lesson is he or she free to work with the materials—calmly, quietly—on their own, in their own private space. How could this possibly work? This particular level of training is intended for the catechesis of exuberant 3, 4, and 5 year-olds, a population not particularly known for being calm, quiet, rule-followers!

But as the week progressed, I began to understand. Building upon a foundation of love, respect, and self-control, the children are formed; nurturing their natural sense of awe, wonder and love of the Gentle Shepherd who loves them, provides for them, and calls them each by name. The “atrium” (not classroom) where the children gather is a place of deep joy and great beauty. It is a remarkable place where children fall in love with Jesus, with Sacred Scripture, and with the Mass and Sacraments in

such a profound way that this passion will endure for the rest of their lives.

As the next few years unfold, Catechesis of the Good Shepherd will gradually replace our conventional religious education program for young people, ages 3 through 12. After attending the training, I am acutely aware of what an enormous gift this program will be for our young people—and for the entire tri-parish community! Thanks to our trainer, Susan Jett and approximately two dozen other trainees who walked with me on the week-long journey of discovery: the experience was AMAZING!! As a fellow traveler stated at the end of the course: “When I first came here, I was skeptical about this program. Now, I can't see forming children any other way!”
