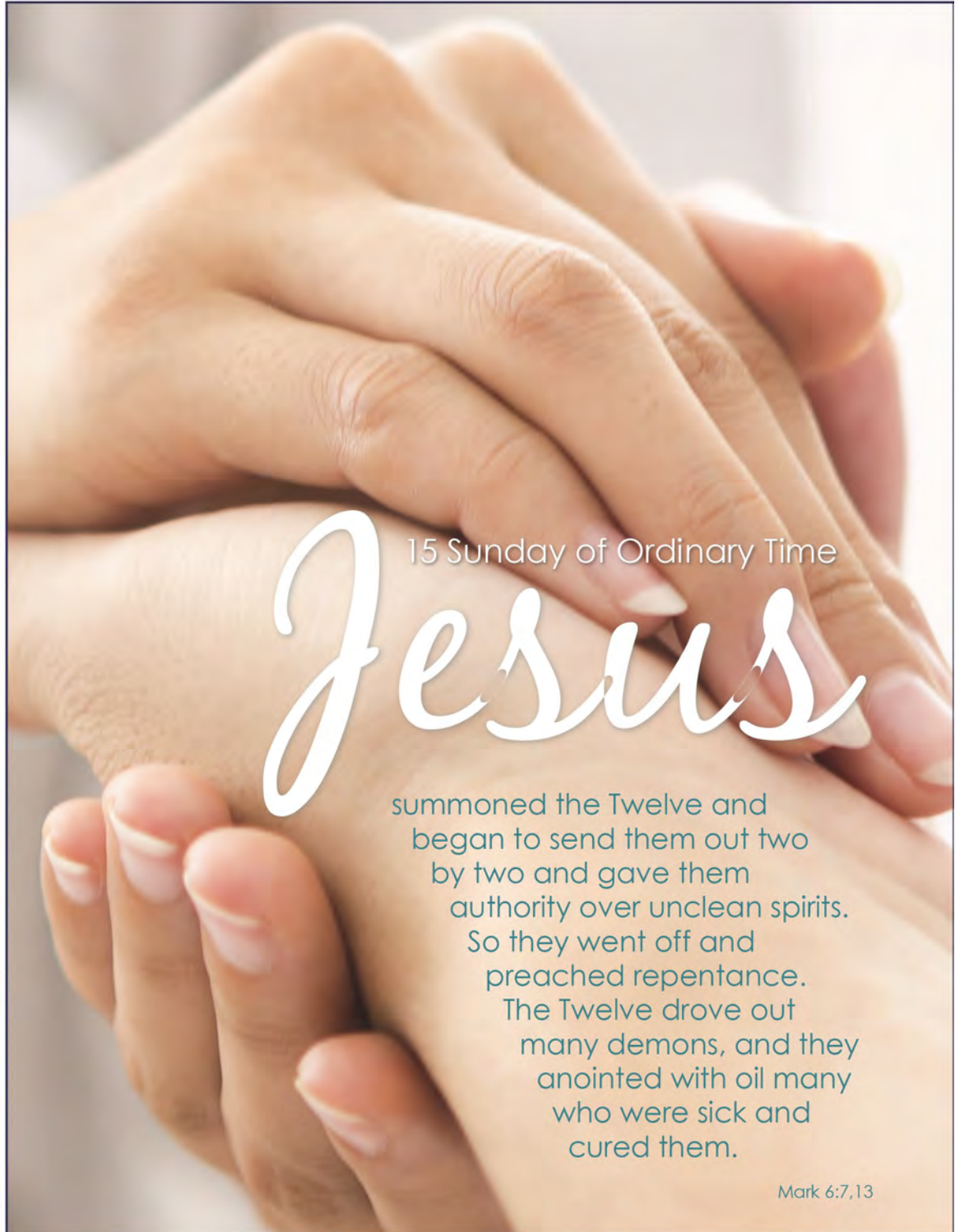

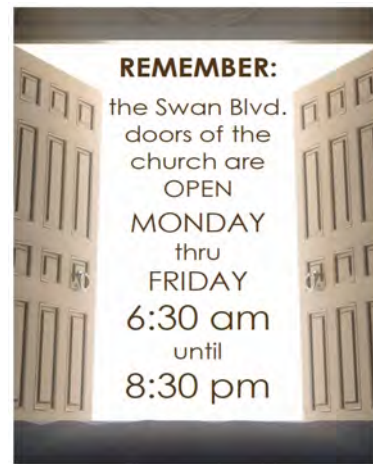

School News

On Monday, July 9, Wisconsin's Attorney General Brad Schimel announced during a press conference here at Christ King, the 52 schools and school districts that have been awarded the next round of grants through the Wisconsin Department of Justice School Safety Grant program, administered by DOJ's Office of School Safety. Christ King School is one of twenty awardees from the Milwaukee area!

Members of Christ King School and Parish were present as well as members of other local schools and law enforcement as they listened to Attorney General Schimel share that the 52 schools and school districts combined will receive \$3,501,346 which will be spent on building safety improvements, as well as training for faculty and staff.

"Momentum to improve school safety, training, and law enforcement collaboration continues with today's school safety grant awards," said Attorney General Schimel. "The public safety professionals at DOJ, in conjunction with dozens of educational and mental health response professionals, established a meaningful way to improve school safety by strengthening response to mental health crises and improving the physical safety of school buildings."

Our school principal, Gina Brown shared with reporters how the \$15,743 of grant money came at the perfect time for us. "We have been saving up funds for new safety features such as shatterproof glass, cameras in the school, and training for our teachers and staff as these types of measures can never be fully implemented with a school budget. We can now use the grant money for those, as well as for additional security upgrades."

On behalf of our parish community, the Christ King Human Concerns Committee (HCC) responds to Jesus' command to love our neighbor as ourselves by working for the common good.

Through several sub-committees and many dedicated volunteers, the HCC seeks to support those in need within our parish and throughout the greater Milwaukee community. Our focus is to alleviate hunger, homelessness, illiteracy, loneliness, and other forms of suffering. This is done through our Care Ministries (Bereavement, Shepherd and Prayer Shawl Ministries, birthday cards to parish seniors, get well and sympathy cards, funeral receptions, Ministry of Praise, and Women's Prayer Circle), Alcohol & Drug Awareness, and Parish Library; our support of Greater Tosa Interfaith, Habitat for Humanity, and St. Vincent de Paul Meal Programs; and through our seasonal outreach projects (back-to-school drive, food drives, spring & fall clothing drives, Christmas Giving Tree, Lenten CRS rice bowl drive, and Mother's Day rose sale).

In addition to giving of self, our parish community – through your stewardship and additional donations – also provides financial support to worthy groups and organizations within our parish, the greater Milwaukee community, and agencies that address an international need. Beneficiaries of this support are primarily the elderly; individuals and families who are hungry, homeless, or are lacking basic necessities; those who have physical, mental, or emotional challenges; and agencies that provide pro-life education and/or ongoing support to pregnant women.

OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL

The origins of this feast reach all the way back to the Old Testament. In the book of Kings, we read the story of the prophet Elijah. Much of his prayer, fasting, and public ministry occurred from Carmel, a mountain in Israel. Christian hermits -- seeking solitude -- made their homes on the mountain during the first millennium. Over time, the hermits assembled into a community and were given a Rule of Life. They named their church after Mary -- Our Lady

of Mount Carmel. Political upheaval forced the Carmelite order out of the Holy Land and into Europe, where they established monasteries for both men and women across the continent. Many great saints and doctors of the Church have come from the Carmelite order, including St. Teresa of Avila, St. John of the Cross, St. Therese of Lisieux, and St. Edith Stein.
