**“May God Who Has Begun the Good Work in You Bring it to Fulfillment”  
Mission Clarity for Saint Bernard and Christ King Parishes (Part 3 of 4)**

Last week I spoke of the importance of growth in discipleship, the discipleship formation roadmap our parishes will use as we consider current and future plans, and the reality that people are at different points in the discipleship journey. This week, I want to speak a bit about the initial “on-ramp” to discipleship; the “on-ramp” will introduce something new to our parishes.

When Pope Benedict XVI visited the United States in April, 2008, he visited Saint Patrick Cathedral in New York City where he spoke very profoundly about how the architecture of the sacred space speaks of God's presence in our world. He noted, with particular profundity, the stained-glass windows in St. Patrick's Cathedral, saying: “From the outside, those windows are dark, heavy, even dreary.” Dramatically, he then added, “But once one enters the church, they suddenly come alive; reflecting the light pass through them, they reveal all their splendor.” Correlating the stained glass imagery to the intended role the Church (parish) plays in helping people hear and live God's call to discipleship, Benedict continued: “It is only from the inside, from the experience of faith and ecclesial life, that we see the Church as she truly is: flooded with grace, resplendent in beauty, adorned with the manifold gifts of the Spirit.”

I find Pope Benedict's observation of stained-glass windows very powerful as a metaphor for our current task of discipleship. As a lifelong Catholic, I share a weakness with many of you—the weakness that we often underestimate how foreign and how puzzling faith can look to someone who is not yet a disciple. You may have experienced this if you've invited non-Catholics or non-Christians to Mass. For people who don't yet understand the meaning of what happens at Mass, the experience can truly be confusing and intimidating. As Catholics, we understand the flow and the basic meaning of what goes on; we know what to expect and we know somewhat why we're doing what we're doing. But to someone who does not yet know God or who doesn't share our Catholic faith the Mass might look vague or empty, as heavy dreary stained-glass windows look from the outside.

Keeping Pope Benedict's stained-glass imagery in mind, we must be purposefully cognizant about how our parishes welcome and assist people who are first awakening to God's presence and call. As we seek to personally grow as Jesus' disciples and fulfill Jesus' call to bring others to him, we need to pay close attention to those who are new to exploring a personal relationship with God and/or the Catholic faith. An integral part of our parishes' spiritual roadmap must include an “on-ramp,” a very basic invitational process that allows individuals to ask questions and slowly learn more about what a life with Jesus Christ means. One method that has been used for years in both non-Catholic communities and in Catholic settings is the *Alpha* process.

*Alpha* is an 11-week set of meetings which includes a meal, a high-quality video, and small group discussion. *Alpha* begins by grounding us with the same questions we all ask: Why am I here; Is there more to life than this? Over time, the *Alpha* process introduces the proposal that Jesus Christ is the answer to every human question.

*Alpha* is the first letter of the Greek alphabet. Jesus Christ has been described (in the Book of Revelation) as the *Alpha* and the *Omega*, which means the beginning and the end. The *Alpha* process is designed only to be the start of the process of the discipleship journey, not the end, not the answer to every question, and not the end of a journey of faith and to the Church.

The *Alpha* process is new to both our parishes and will be regularly occurring several times per year. *Alpha* will start at both parish locations late this summer and I strongly encourage everyone to be part of the *Alpha* process.

From experience in other settings, to be successful, *Alpha* will have two needs on our part. First, *Alpha* requires all of us to foster a culture of invitation. *Alpha* is designed to be respectful and hospitable to one who is at any point in their journey of life. At our parishes, it must become our habit to be intentionally inviting to our friends, family members, neighbors, and others by asking them to consider deepening their relationship with Jesus Christ by joining *Alpha*. And we must accompany them as friends, as many of Jesus' disciples came to a new life because of a relationship with someone they trust.

The second need for *Alpha* to be successful is the continued development of a "hand-off" process. This means there must always be a place for people to grow in discipleship once they've completed the *Alpha* series. An integral part of our parishes' renewal roadmap must be opportunities such as small groups for *Alpha* participants to continue to grow as Jesus' disciples. This will take some work.

I am excited to finally undertake *Alpha*. I and other parishioners have researched and observed *Alpha's* process and impact in other environments for several years. I strongly invite and encourage every single person to take part in an *Alpha* session soon. *Alpha* will take place simultaneously at both Christ King and Saint Bernard locations. Our first round of *Alpha* will be a time to work out the wrinkles, so come help with your participation. Watch the bulletin for details.

Wherever you are at in your journey of discipleship, *Alpha* provides a process and a space to **remember** why we are disciples in the first place, and to reacquaint ourselves with Jesus Christ. This is only a good thing.

Next week I will conclude these thoughts on our parishes' spiritual focus moving forward. This week I ask you to seriously think of two people you could invite to attend *Alpha* with you this fall. Watch for more information on the start of *Alpha*, sign up and start inviting!




### Kid's Small Group Leaders--Join our Team!

## What is the best part of your job?

**Sam:** I absolutely love being in the Atrium (the room that is prepared specifically for children to encounter God) with the children and being witness to the work of the Holy Spirit within them. I also love helping parents learn how to walk alongside their children in their relationship with Christ.

**Sarah:** Hearing the Gospel message as a junior in high school changed my life. It gave me purpose, mission, hope, and joy. I can't believe I get to dedicate my entire life to sharing that Good News with others! Plus, working with the Holy Spirit, teens, and middle school students – my job is full of the unexpected.

**Emily:** So far I have loved getting to know individuals at Christ King, hearing their stories, and helping to continue to grow the parish in authentic discipleship!

## What are the challenges of your job?

**Sam:** I think a unique challenge in any ministry job is to surrender to the timing and work of the Holy Spirit. Most of what I do is plant small mustard seeds and then my work is to trust God to do with it what He wills. It is hard to trust, to wait, and to trust some more! I want to see the fruit right away, but God always calls us to a place of trust and surrender in Him.

**Sarah:** Breaking through barriers and winning the right to be heard by a generation of people who are often taught not to trust the Church, organized religion, or a God who allows suffering.

This fall is all about Alpha. This incredible resource empowers participants to have open, honest discussion about their faith. First, they will be invited to share a meal together, then hear the Gospel message, stories of conversion, and the simple teachings of Christ. After the message, they will have an honest conversation about what they believe, even if it's not what everyone else believes. It's a place for Catholics, atheists, agnostics, and anyone in between to find their voice and explore the truth of the Gospel together.

**Emily:** Often in ministry, things do not go exactly the way that I plan in my head. A challenging thing for me is to continue to listen to the Lord's voice in all things. Though something might not end up exactly as I have imagined, it might be exactly what the Lord wants!

## Where is your favorite place to pray?

**Sam:** In my living room, in my green chair, wrapped up in my white, fluffy blanket with coffee in hand. It helps if the sun is peering through my blinds and my kids are still asleep!

**Sarah:** I love praying in front of the tabernacle of an empty Church. It's peaceful and free of distractions. That's why I love that our church is open every day for prayer!

**Emily:** In front of the tabernacle! Nothing beats being in the presence of our Lord! But at home, I have a great wooden prayer rocking chair that I have a lot of pride in because I got it for \$10 at a rummage sale. Anyone who has found a great second-hand deal understands why this makes it an even more amazing prayer chair!

## What are some of your favorite religious resources?

**Sam:** I highly recommend the new CGS (Catechesis of the Good Shepherd) website: [cgsusa.org](http://cgsusa.org). On it you will find amazing resources about the spiritual life of the child along with parent articles that explain different elements of CGS and how you can implement different things at home. You can also find videos and pictures of various CGS materials and presentations that can help you visualize what may happen in any given Atrium session.

**Sarah:** I fell in love with Scripture 10 years ago and it has changed my life. Praying with the Bible is my favorite way to pray now. One book that helped me understand the big story of the Old and New Testament and make connections to my Catholic faith is "Walking with God" by Tim Gray. It's an easy read and will help readers understand the amazing, long story about how God saves us. I also love reading the journals and writings of our great saints – they have taught me how to have intimacy, humility, and honesty with God in prayer.

**Emily:** My favorite prayer book titled "In Conversation with God," is a series of short meditations that go along with the daily readings. They are the bomb! Another great prayer resource is "Introduction to Ignatian Prayer," by Fr. Timothy Gallagher. For good podcasts, I highly recommend Abiding Together, Fr. Mike Schmitz Podcast, and Two Guys and a Gospel (of course!!).

## Are there any places around Milwaukee that you find spiritually enlightening?

**Sam:** A couple! There is a nature center near my home that helps me encounter God--I love being outdoors! I also love the lower chapels at the Basilica of St. Josephat and the Basilica of Holy Hill.

**Sarah:** I do an annual retreat at Redemptorist Retreat Center, which is situated on a small lake and has beautiful walking paths and spots for prayer. I also love going to Mass at the Basilica. When you step into the Basilica church, you know that this is a sacred place. A generation of people gave everything they had to build a beautiful house to honor and worship God. What a gift!

**Emily:** A little place I will hide away to when I need a "busy person's" personal retreat is the St. Joseph Chapel on Layton Boulevard in Milwaukee. The chapel is inside a building that is the International Office for the School Sisters of St. Francis. You can check-in at the front desk and go up to the second floor to spend some time in prayer. It. Is. BEAUTIFUL. A complete gem tucked away in Milwaukee. I highly recommend checking it out!
