



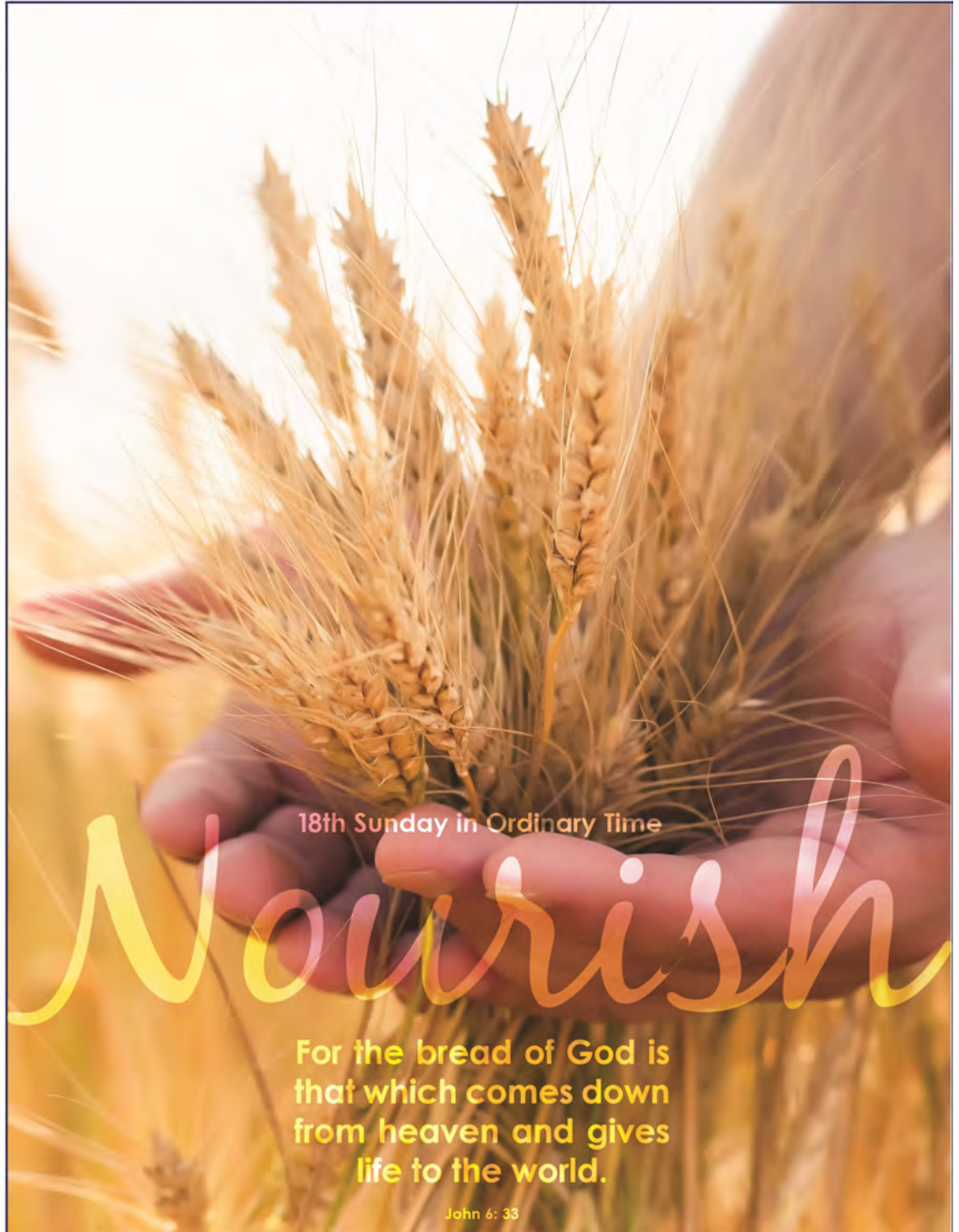

# IN THE SPOTLIGHT

When I was in college at UWM I took a sociology class that required me to read an essay called "Bowling Alone" by Robert Putnam. As I recall, (and it's been a while since I read it) the point of the essay focuses primarily on the decline of social engagement that tends to enrich and bring more value to our lives. There were more social groups, especially in post-WWII America, which people joined for the sake of community; for instance, bowling leagues, civic groups, etc. Over time, America became more and more individualistic and the tendency to join groups like these sharply declined and began to die out. Though the document's focus is intended to highlight the area of civic engagement, I think that there is a lot to be said about how there has been and continues to be a decline in person-to-person, human interaction in our world. In short, we've lost a sense of community.

As a result of becoming so disconnected from the rest of society we look for new ways to establish and develop relationships. Cell phones, the internet and technology in general have become the new means to fill the void. They are how we "stay connected." The problem is that they've led our society to the point of living outside of reality in many respects. Culturally, western civilization has migrated into a false reality—a fantasy. Two examples of the worst of fantasies that come to mind are the use of pornography and an excessive use of social media. The way that our society now "stays connected" is not realistic in any sense of the word. Rather, it's a false world lived out in the mind. Losing a sense of community through fantasy has resulted in a terrible loneliness.

There are so many lonely people in our world and in the recent past we have seen a statistically strong up-tick in loneliness. I meet so many joyful and welcoming people at St. Bernard's and Christ King. I encourage all of you to continue to be welcoming to newcomers, but also to consider reaching out to someone you don't know, but who you might sit near at Mass. They might be having a difficult time with loneliness and you could be the source of hope that they need.

Don't forget the many people who struggle from loneliness not through their own fault, but through the scourge of depression and other mental illnesses. For some of these folks, the loneliness might be so suffocating that just getting out of bed and getting dressed is a heroic effort. Many people in these troubling situations suffer so badly that they turn to suicide as a way out of the pain. Pray for them especially through the intercession of St. Dymphna and St. Rita of Cascia, the patronesses of mental illness and loneliness. More actively, if you sense that someone really is considering ending their life, then reach out and ask. If so, you might be the one to help them ultimately receive the necessary treatment to regain emotional and social health so that they can live the fullness of life that the Lord desires for them.

When winter comes around we're less likely to stand outside and talk to neighbors. Take the opportunity now while it's still pleasant outside to get to know some people in your neighborhood. You never know, it might be the one conversation that helps someone to experience God's love and know that they are valuable members of a community. That one conversation could also lead to a lifelong and life-giving relationship. In the words of St. Pope John Paul II: Be not afraid!
