The call to a Catholic pilgrimage is a personal invitation from God to leave day-to-day life and embark on a focused journey to grow closer to God. In the Catholic faith the entirety of one's life can be considered a pilgrimage with a goal of meeting God in heaven.

The pilgrimage is planned for **Friday, September 8; departure is scheduled for approximately 5:00 am.** September 8th is the Feast of the Birth of Mary. Depending on room availability at Holy Hill, some pilgrims plan to stay overnight (Friday) in the Shrine's guest quarters.

My Fourth Book Report

Book: The Eucharist

Author: Bishop Robert Barron

Spirituality index: ΔΔ,

Some knowledge of Catholic faith helpful

Father's Comment: Robert Barron has the skill to write about complex theological issues and make them understandable. Of all of Bishop Barron's books, I reference this most commonly.

Book Report:

The Eucharist is the foundation of our Catholic faith and worship.

The meaning of Eucharist is 'thanksgiving' and this must be remembered

as you read this book. But it is not a sense of "giving" that we are to be thankful for, but rather a giving of total self, something we barely believe possible. This is the gift of the Eucharist. Bishop Barron finds a human expression in the story of Babette's Feast.

Just recently we contemplated the offering of the Body and Blood of Christ in the feast of Corpus Christi. This sharing of a sacred meal is the first image we are given. The closeness and sharing of ourselves has always been around the bounty give to us by God. Sharing of a fish dinner of his disciples and the Risen Christ emphasizes that this participation in our lives is not ended with Jesus after his death.

Frequently in worship, we refer to the Eucharist as a sacrifice. Bishop Barron walks us through the Old Testament and the concept of covenant and sacrifice being the bond that holds the two parties in union. I'm sure all of us who were married could understand the sacrifice that goes into a good marriage, but yet the joy of communion is what we really remember.

Take some time and read this book slowly and read it holding a highlighter. When you are done the phrase and thoughts will strengthen your understanding of this most precious gift.
