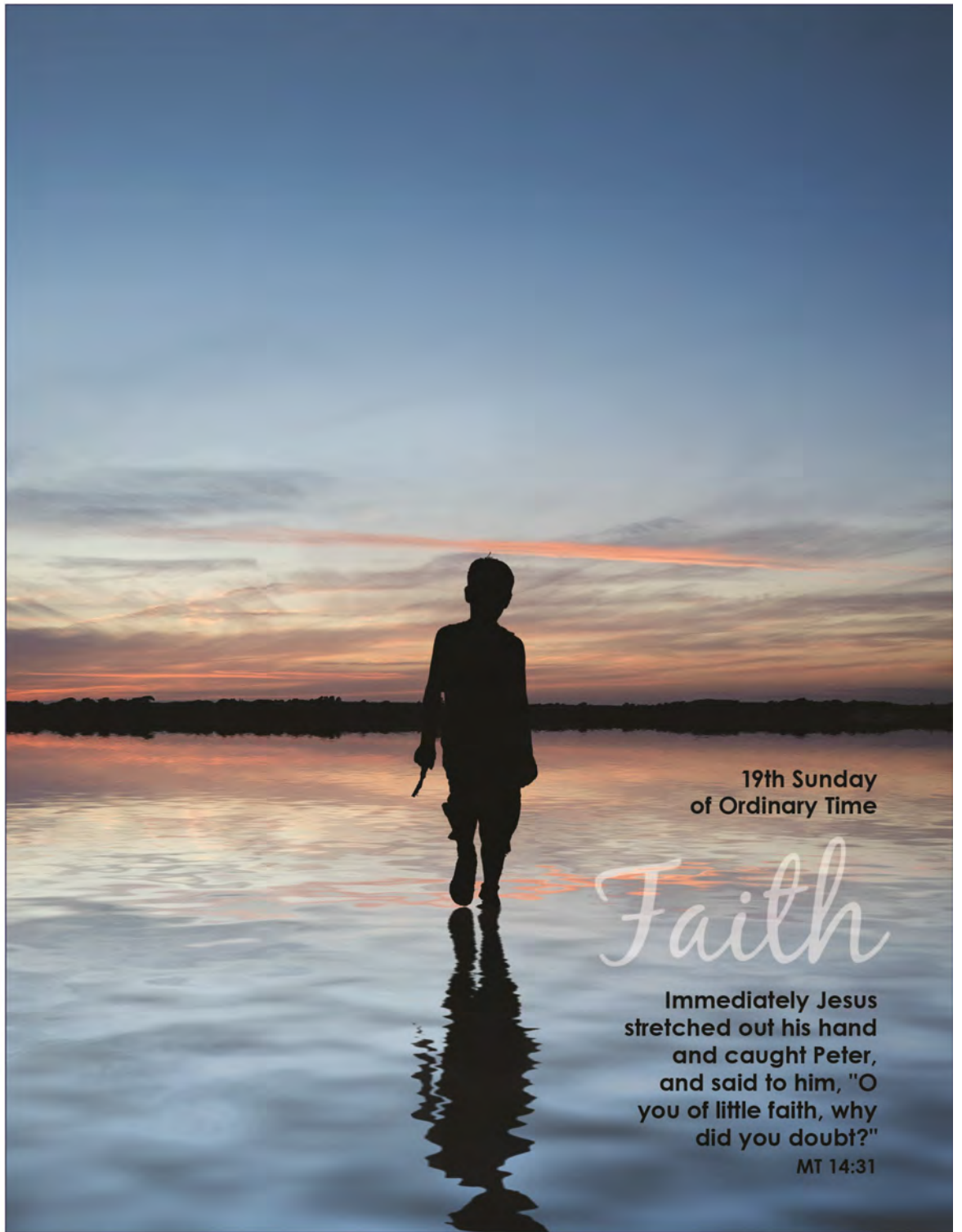

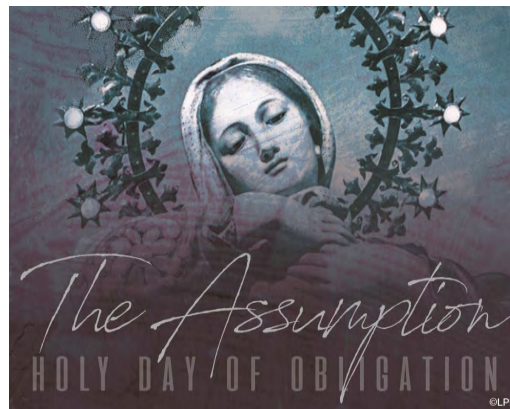

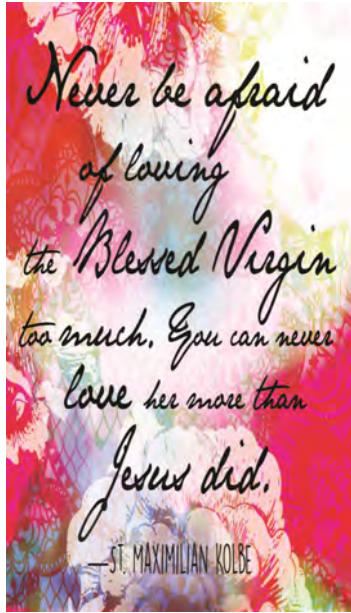


The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary



The church has always held to the belief that Mary was assumed, body and soul, into a heavenly state, even though the belief was not declared as dogmatic until 1950. The early church had a robust tradition of revering relics from the saints of the day, and their complete lack of relics from the Mother of Jesus was seen as evidence of this Marian belief. The celebration of the event as a feast dates back to the fourth century in the East and the seventh century in the West.

Since Mary was untouched by the stain of sin, she was unable to experience the "wages of sin," which is death. But her Assumption also says something about humanity as well. Sin only has power over us if we allow it. Mary was freed from this power in her Immaculate Conception, and when she responded "yes" to God. We were freed from that power when Jesus died and rose, conquering death. Now, we must respond "yes" to claim the victory that was already won for us. On this feast, we should not only celebrate the great works God has done for us through Our Lady, but also celebrate the truth that we have the opportunity to one day spend eternity with her and her Son, Jesus.



SCRIP is a program that allows members of the school and/or parish to purchase gift certificates or gift cards for use at many local and national businesses. In return, these businesses give Christ King Parish a varying percent (anywhere from 1 to 25%) for each certificate or gift card purchased. 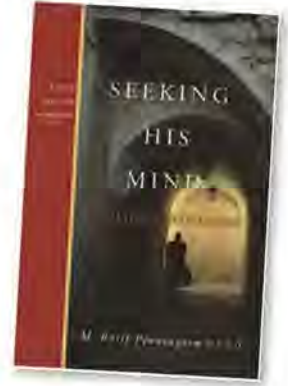
My Fifth Book Report

Book: Seeking His Mind

Author: M. Basil Pennington O.C.S.O.

Spirituality index: ΔΔΔΔ, advanced spirituality (this is my subjective thinking)

Father's Comment: Dom Basil Pennington is a Trappist monk and priest who received his pontifical degree when I was 4 years old...and that is a long time ago! This book is for those to whom a fire has been started in their hearts. It is for those who wish the next step to the 1% Challenge.



Book Report: If you have been inspired by the 1% Challenge, this book is for you. Basil Pennington is a well-known spiritual leader in the Thomas Merton tradition. He offers the gambit of prayer styles from traditional to centering prayer. In this book, he uses the ancient practice of Lectio Divina as a means of spiritual advancement and illumination. Lectio Divina is a way of approaching the scriptures and reflecting on them to transform your soul. The author uses 40 different scripture passages and offers reflections that will help facilitate our response to God's love for us.

Each of the forty scriptures quoted is followed by sort of a mini-homily and finishes with answering the question, "What does this mean to me?" Pennington is not afraid to tackle difficult scriptures and explore areas that may be a bit tender to us. The book is divided into three sections, Beginnings, Teaching and Healing, and Passion and Resurrection.

Each chapter is short reading and the time spent on them is to be more contemplative than explanatory. As this type of journey doesn't appeal to everyone, all I can say is that if you experienced the 1% Challenge and was changed and looking for more this book is it.

The call to a Catholic pilgrimage is a personal invitation from God to leave day-to-day life and embark on a focused journey to grow closer to God. In the Catholic faith the entirety of one's life can be considered a pilgrimage with a goal of meeting God in heaven.

This year Christ King is offering an opportunity for a 28-mile walking pilgrimage to Holy Hill.

The goal is for parishioners to participate in one of two ways; The first would be to gather any pilgrims capable and called to make the journey and invite them to walk with us. The second is to ask the faithful at Christ King Parish for their written prayers. All prayers will be carried on the pilgrimage and read at the foot of the Blessed Mother in the Shrine Chapel at Holy Hill. Opportunities to submit prayers will be offered at Mass August 19/20 and 26/27, on the parish website, christkingparish.org, or at the parish office.

The pilgrimage is planned for Friday, September 8

Our departure is scheduled for approximately 5:00 am. September 8th is the Feast of the Birth of Mary. Depending on room availability at Holy Hill, some pilgrims plan to stay overnight (Friday) in the Shrine's guest quarters.
