What can a parish offer in the way of community that anyone living in the surrounding area couldn't experience outside of church? Many would respond-nothing! We have friends, I experience God in my own way, I even volunteer time and money to worthy charitable causes. Who needs the church hassle?

*"But the Lord God called to the Man, and said to him, "Where are you?" Genesis 3:9*

If you are reading this chances are you went to church today or at least thought about going to church today. Why? What is it that drew your thoughts to worship. A beautiful Church? An upcoming wedding? Grandma wants our baby baptized, I'd better go to church? I need God to answer my prayer? I need to set a good example for my kids? There are many reasons to attend Mass (and just as many not too) some noble, some not so much. Often we come to "get something" from God. In reality it is God who seeks us out and calls us in spite of ourselves, even using our sometimes selfish motivations to reveal divine presence in our lives.
