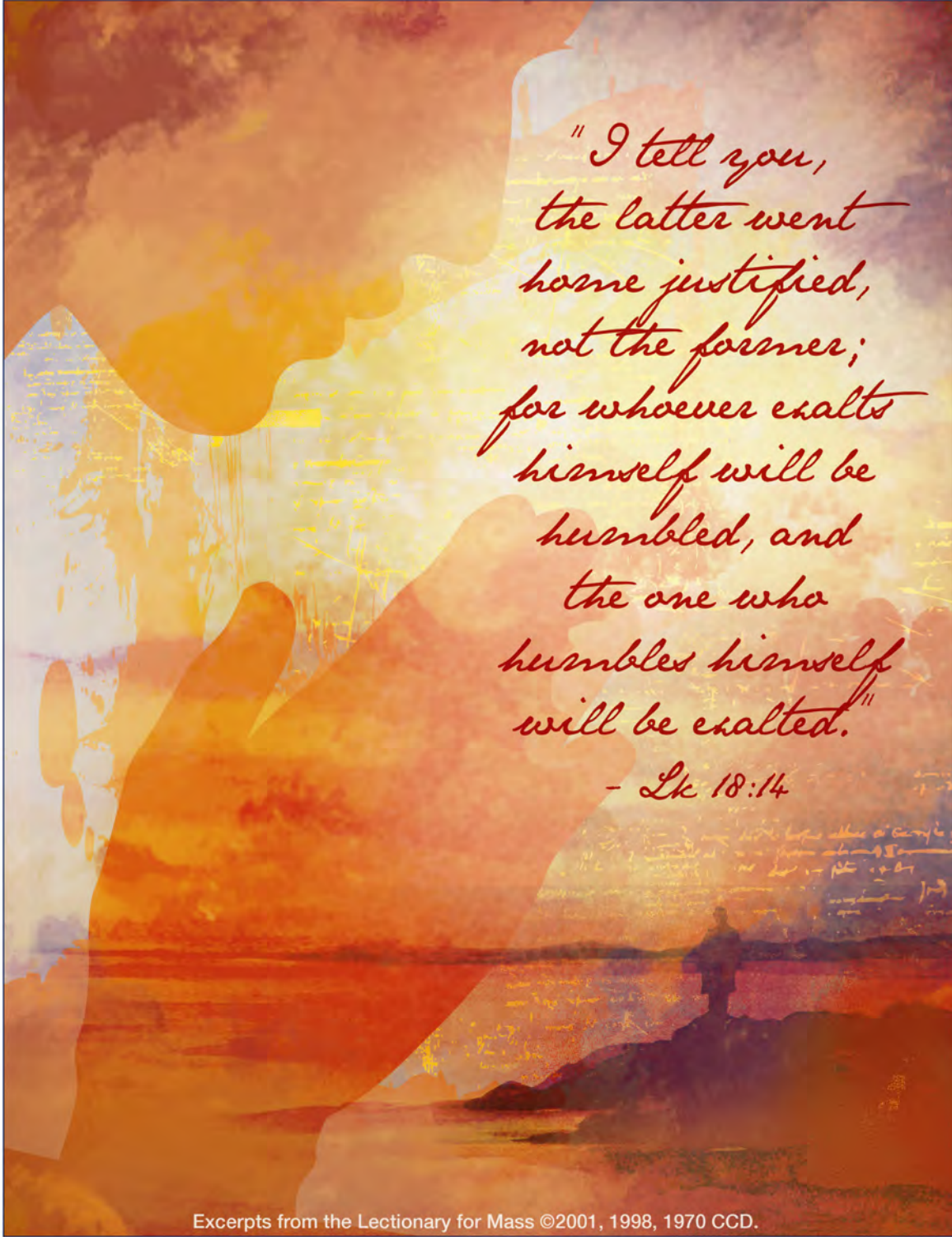

Your Generosity Continues!

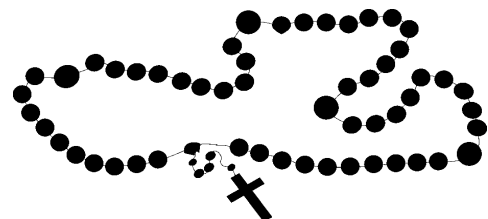

This is the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. We pray for all who have died and need our prayers. Please come to our annual Mass on Wednesday, November 2 at 7:00 p.m. Remember those who have died at any point in time. This is always a very peaceful Mass and I encourage you to come and pray. Bring a picture of your loved one if you so desire. A small reception will follow.

Disposition of Cremated Bodies

One of the Corporal Works of Mercy is to "Bury the Dead." We do this by attending to the bodies of those who have died, providing the dignity their body deserves, until that day when Christ calls us all together once again in His friendship.

Over time, for various reasons, families have kept cremated remains in their homes. On November 2 the Archdiocese is providing, free of charge, an opportunity to bury the dead. Anyone who has the cremated remains can have them buried at Holy Cross Cemetery in a community crypt. Archbishop ListECKi will celebrate Mass on November 2 at 8:30 a.m. for these individuals. This is the Church providing this work of mercy to all those who desire to now bury their loved ones with the dignity the body requires. Names will be inscribed near the crypt. Anyone wishing to take advantage of this must complete the attached form by October 26.
