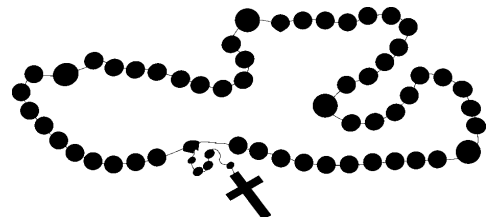

Holiday Coffee Sale

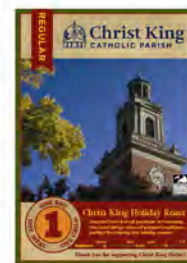

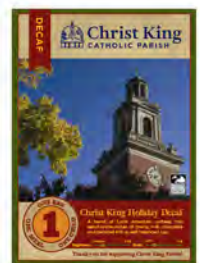
